

TUITION & FEES 2012-2013

TUITION

Tuition for full-time students enrolled in 12.0 - 19.5 quarter hours per term is \$4,600 each term. Tuition for part-time students enrolled in 6.5 - 11.5 quarter hours is \$2,300 per term. Tuition for students enrolled in 6.0 quarter hours or less is \$1,150 per term. Students can freeze their tuition costs by enrolling and maintaining full-time status. An individual who has attained a bachelor's degree or higher, and wishes to enroll in classes as an undeclared student to meet the credit hour requirements to sit for the CPA exam, is eligible for a post-bachelor's tuition rate of \$895 for a 4.5 quarter hour course.

PAYMENT OF STUDENT ACCOUNTS

Payments for tuition, housing, and fees are due on or before the first day of each term. Balances must be covered by some means of financial aid or other documented assistance by the first day of each term. If these items are not in place, the student will be required to:

- Pay account balance in full personally OR
 - Request a payment plan with \$30 service fee assessed
- AIB accepts cash, checks, VISA, MasterCard, American Express and Discover.

GRADUATION FEE

All students are required to pay a \$60 graduation fee at the beginning of their final terms of enrollment for both the associate's and bachelor's degrees.

PARKING FEE

All motor vehicles, including motorcycles, require an AIB parking permit. A permit to park on campus may be purchased at the Bookstore for \$25 per term. Unregistered vehicles are subject to parking tickets or towing at the owner's expense. Free parking is available on some streets near the campus. Students should have appropriate insurance coverage. The College is not responsible for any damage or theft that might occur while vehicles are parked on campus.

TRANSCRIPT FEE

Graduates receive one official transcript free of charge, which is delivered with the diploma. No transcript will be released unless all financial and other obligations to the College have been met. Requests for transcripts must be made in writing to the Registrar. There is a \$10 fee for an official copy, with the following exception:

- Current students may request transcripts for employment or scholarship purposes.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

All students are required to pay a \$70 technology fee each term.

STUDENT ID REPLACEMENT FEE

All students receive a student ID upon their enrollment. A replacement fee of \$10 is charged if the ID is lost.

BOOKS AND SUPPLIES

Books and college supplies purchased at the AIB Eagle's Landing Bookstore cost approximately \$400 per term for full-time students. However, depending on the number and type of classes in which the student is enrolled, the cost can vary. Book buy back is offered at the end of each term. Used books may be available. Online students will incur shipping costs.

ACTIVITIES AND STUDENT GOVERNMENT FEE

All students are required to pay both a \$7 activities fee each term and a \$3 Student Government fee each term.

COURSE SPECIFIC EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

Various courses of study require specific equipment. Equipment expense is in addition to tuition and fee costs and is the responsibility of the student. Equipment costs may change based upon cost changes by the suppliers.

RESIDENCE HALL FEES 2012-2013

HOUSING FEE

The residence housing fee varies according to the living arrangements for each resident. The fee covers from the day prior to the beginning of the term until the day after the term ends. The housing fee includes gas heat, water, basic cable, local phone, and high speed internet service. Electricity is included for Fenton Hall only. Residents of all other residence halls are required to pay their own electricity billed by the College.

The housing fee for Fenton Hall East and Fenton Hall West includes all utilities. The housing fee for Merk and Dalton Halls and the Fleur Apartments includes the cost of heat and water. Residents in these halls are responsible for the cost of electricity and will be billed monthly by the College. Bills are to be paid at Business Services as soon as they are received, and roommates are expected to pay equal shares of the bill. If a student is suspended they must vacate the residence hall within 24 hours, and no housing refund will be granted. If a student withdraws from classes before the end of the term, they will be refunded according to the College refund policy.

RESIDENCE HALL DEPOSIT

A \$200 housing reservation deposit is strongly encouraged within 45 days of acceptance. Housing assignments are made on a first-come, first-served basis once a student has been both accepted and deposited. The deposit is refundable if the College is notified of cancellation by May 1 for fall term start dates or 30 days prior to winter, spring, or summer start dates. A refund is made only if the cancellation notice applies to the initial enrollment date.

RESIDENCE HALL TELEPHONE SERVICE

Local telephone service is provided to each apartment at no charge. Students must provide their own phones.

HOUSING INTERNET ACCESS

Students living on campus may connect their own computers to the Internet from their apartments which are wired for this service. There is no charge for this high-speed, broadband service. AIB also has a campus-wide wireless network through which students may use wireless laptops to connect to the network.

* All costs and fees are subject to change. All tuition, housing, and other fees are due on or before the first day of each term. Students must remit payment, provide proof of program assistance, or complete a payment agreement with 1/3 of total costs received before beginning classes.

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS 2012-2013

Scholarships and grants are generally for tuition only and are awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. Scholarships are renewable upon maintaining the required minimum cumulative GPA and proper social standing. AIB will freeze tuition for students who enroll and maintain full-time status. Scholarships will not be renewed for students who withdraw and re-enroll at a later date. Additional scholarships may be available.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE STUDENTS

FOUNDER'S SCHOLARSHIP

\$4,600 max per term

Qualifications: 3.75 cumulative GPA and top 10% of HS class
OR
3.75 cumulative GPA and 27 or higher ACT

The merit-based Founder's Scholarship is a full tuition scholarship named after Everett O. Fenton, founder of AIB College of Business in 1921. AIB will offer up to five new Founder's Scholarships per year. This scholarship is available to incoming first-year students that meet the scholarship requirements and attend the fall term immediately after high school. Qualified students must apply for admission, apply for the Founder's Scholarship, and be accepted no later than February 1. Students must also complete their FAFSA and AIB Institutional Aid Application by February 1. Students will attend the AIB Founder's Scholarship Day in February as well. The Founder's Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. Pell eligible students living on campus will be able to apply their Pell Grant to their AIB on-campus housing cost. Participants must complete an essay and interview as part of the scholarship competition. Scholarship winners will be notified within 2 weeks after the competition. The Founder's Scholarship is based on academics, merit, leadership and service. The Founder's Scholarship Committee will determine the scholarship recipients. The Founder's Scholarship will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. If continuing on to the bachelor's degree immediately after completion of the AIB associate's degree, the Founder's Scholarship will remain in effect. The scholarship is renewable if academic eligibility is met and will be reviewed at the end of each term. Recipients must maintain full-time status, proper social standing, and a minimum 3.5 cumulative grade point average (GPA). If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 3.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, or if the student drops to part-time status, the scholarship will revert to the Honors Scholarship and will remain at the lower level for the duration of the student's eligibility.

HONORS SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,500 max per term for full-time students

\$500 max per term for part-time students

Qualifications: 3.50 cumulative GPA and top 25% of HS class
OR
3.50 cumulative GPA and 25 or higher ACT
OR

For those transferring in 12 or more college credits, the cumulative college GPA will be used.

The Honors Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The Honors Scholarship will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 3.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the scholarship will revert to the Eagles Scholarship and will remain at the lower level for the duration of the student's eligibility.

EAGLES SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 max per term for full-time students

\$250 max per term for part-time students

Qualifications: 3.00 cumulative GPA and top 50% of HS class
OR
3.00 cumulative GPA and 20 or higher ACT
OR

For those transferring in 12 or more college credits, the cumulative college GPA will be used.

The Eagles Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The Eagles Scholarship will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 3.0 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the Eagles Scholarship for the duration of their associate degree program.

AIB SCHOLARSHIP

\$750 max per term for full-time students

Qualifications: 2.5 to 2.99 cumulative high school GPA
For those transferring in 12 or more college credits, the cumulative college GPA will be used.

The AIB Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The AIB Scholarship will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a

minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the AIB Scholarship for the duration of their associate degree program.

NON-TRADITIONAL GRANT

\$500 or \$1,000 max per term for full-time students

\$250 or \$500 max per term for part-time students

Qualifications: Students who are 24 years or older and have 12 or fewer college credits

OR

Students who have earned a GED equivalency and have 12 or fewer college credits.

Students will need to complete the admissions application process and may be requested to submit a letter of recommendation or attend an on-campus interview. The Non-Traditional Grant is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The need based Non-Traditional Grant will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. The grant is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the grant will be removed for the duration of the student's time in college.

BACHELOR DEGREE STUDENTS

FOUNDER'S SCHOLARSHIP

\$4,600 max per term

The bachelor's version of the Founder's Scholarship is a continuation of the associate degree Founder's Scholarship and is given to those AIB students who immediately continue on to the bachelor's degree program. Please refer to the associate degree student scholarship section for complete eligibility criteria.

HONORS SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,500 max per term for full-time students

\$500 max per term for part-time students

Qualifications: 3.5 cumulative GPA based on associate degree (or highest degree obtained)

The Honors Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA

is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 3.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the scholarship will revert to the Eagles Scholarship and will remain at the lower level for the duration of the bachelor's degree.

EAGLES SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 max per term for full-time students

\$250 max per term for part-time students

Qualifications: 3.0 cumulative GPA based on associate degree (or highest degree obtained)

The Eagles Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 3.0 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the Eagles Scholarship for the duration of their bachelor's degree program.

AIB SCHOLARSHIP

\$750 max per term for full-time students

Qualifications: 2.5 cumulative GPA based on associate degree (or highest degree obtained)

The AIB Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the AIB Scholarship for the duration of their bachelor's degree program.

ADDITIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

(Associate & Bachelor)

AIB MONROE COLSTON DIVERSITY LEADERSHIP GRANT (Associate & Bachelor)

\$1,000 max per term for full-time students

AIB will offer up to 15 Monroe Colston Diversity Leadership Grants each academic year to incoming full time new and transfer students who are from a diverse background. Students may receive this grant in addition to one of the aforementioned merit scholarships/grants. The grant is available to minority students and students with disabilities who are US citizens. The grants are competitive, require an application, and the initial award is given in the Fall Term.

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS 2012-2013

To be considered for the grant a student must:

- Apply and be accepted for admission by April 1
- Complete the financial aid process by April 1
- Complete the AIB Monroe Colston Diversity Leadership Grant application by April 30
- A letter of recommendation from a non-family member is encouraged but not required.

The competitive factors considered will include examples of community service efforts demonstrated by volunteer work that positively affected community diversity, and examples of leadership involvement and/or leadership potential. The candidate's racial and demographic characteristics, ethnic background, and disability will be considered. The AIB Monroe Colston Diversity Leadership Committee will review all applicants and determine the grant recipients. The Monroe Colston Diversity Leadership Grant is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The grant will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. If continuing on to the bachelor's degree immediately after completion of the AIB associate's degree, the Monroe Colston Diversity Leadership Grant will remain in effect. The grant is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing, as well as a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of the term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the grant.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

(Associate & Bachelor)

\$500 per term for full-time students

An international student (not eligible for financial aid) who has been enrolled full-time on campus at AIB for two terms, is not participating in college athletics at the varsity level, and has attained a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA, may receive a \$500 per term scholarship to be applied to on-campus housing costs. Continuation of this scholarship is contingent on the student maintaining full-time on-campus enrollment and a 3.5 or above cumulative GPA.

An international student (not eligible for financial aid) who has been enrolled full-time on-campus at AIB for two terms, and has attained a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA, may receive a \$250 per term scholarship to be applied to on-campus housing costs. Continuation of this scholarship is contingent on the student maintaining full-time on-campus enrollment and a 3.0 or above cumulative GPA.

PHI THETA KAPPA (Bachelor Only)

PTK Members:

- \$500 max per term with 3.5 cumulative GPA for full-time students
- \$250 max per term with 3.5 cumulative GPA for part-time students

The Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Scholarship is open to previously active

members of PTK who have completed an associate degree from an accredited college/university and attend AIB immediately after completion of said degree. Eligible students are invited to complete the Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship application. Students may receive this scholarship in addition to one of the aforementioned merit scholarships/grants not to exceed the tuition cost per term and is awarded in conjunction with federal and state assistance. In order to receive the PTK Scholarship, students must present a letter from their prior PTK advisor to verify membership. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed every term. If the GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 3.0 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the PTK Scholarship for the duration of their bachelor degree program.

E.O. FENTON ALUMNI & FAMILY HOUSING GRANT (Associate & Bachelor)

\$250 per term

This grant is available for AIB campus housing and is awarded to a student who has a family member considered an AIB alumnus or when two or more members of the same family attend AIB concurrently. A family member is defined as a sibling, child, parent, spouse, or grandparent. The award is made at the time of acceptance and requires completion of an EO Fenton Alumni and Family Housing Grant application. Students may receive this grant in addition to one of the aforementioned merit scholarships/grants. This grant will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. If continuing on to the bachelor's degree immediately after completion of the AIB associate's degree, the grant will remain until graduation. The grant is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.0 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the grant.

AIB OUT-OF-STATE TUITION GRANT (Associate & Bachelor)

Up to \$4,000 per year

This grant is awarded to out-of-state residents and students must be in the upper 50% of their high school graduating class, be enrolled in a degree program, and must reside in AIB campus housing. Students must apply for admission and financial aid by April 1, and must meet the financial need requirements of the Iowa Tuition Grant Program. Students may receive this grant in addition to one of the aforementioned merit scholarships/grants. The AIB Out-of-State Tuition Grant is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The grant is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term.

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS 2012-2013

If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.5 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the grant.

AIB SERVICE MEMBERS GRANT (Associate & Bachelor)

\$300 per term for full-time students

This grant is available for severely wounded service members, spouses of severely wounded service members, and children or other family members (e.g. parents) of severely wounded service members. Students may receive this grant in addition to one of the aforementioned merit scholarships/grants. Eligible students are invited to complete the Service Members Grant application. The AIB Service Members Grant is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. Students must be enrolled full time and this grant will remain in effect for the first 126 attempted quarter credit hours. If continuing on to the bachelor's degree immediately after completion of the AIB associate's degree, the grant will remain in effect. The grant is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.0 for the grant to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. If the required GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the grant.

ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIP (Associate & Bachelor)

Athletic scholarships are available for students participating in NAIA and AIB sanctioned programs. The amount of the scholarship will be tailored for each individual participant. Student athletes are required to complete the financial aid process each year. A recipient of an athletic scholarship must be academically eligible for the total sport season for which the scholarship was awarded. Standards for eligibility are set forth by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and AIB.

All new recruited athletes sign a formal letter of intent which contains the terms and conditions of the athletic scholarship made to the student on behalf of the College by the Athletics Department. Enrolled students are required to meet all of the terms and conditions of the athletic scholarship and other NAIA standards of eligibility and those of the College. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.0 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the scholarship for the duration of the student's time at AIB. Each year, the Athletics Director will provide

Financial Aid Services with a comprehensive roster of all continuing athletic scholarships no later than May 1st for the upcoming academic year.

If a student is injured in a practice session or game situation and this injury prohibits the student from further participation, he/she will retain the scholarship for the remainder of his/her athletic eligibility. If a student develops an illness after he/she is actively involved in athletics at AIB and this illness prohibits him/her from further participation in athletics, he/she will retain the scholarship for the period for which it was awarded. The student may be required to provide a note from his/her doctor at the request of the Athletics Director. If a student decides that he/she does not wish to continue to participate in the sport for which the athletic scholarship is designated, or if the student is dismissed from the athletic team for disciplinary reasons, then the scholarship will cease to exist from the day the student quits the team or the date of dismissal by the coach. The coach will confirm the loss of scholarship with the student via e-mail or written notice. The coach will also notify Financial Aid Services via e-mail or written notice within 48 hours. Financial Aid Services will provide the student with a revised financial aid package. The student will be responsible for any financial obligations to the College as a result of this change in athletic scholarship. A student's athletic scholarship will not be in effect for summer terms. Other financial aid policies may apply and a student/family is advised to contact Financial Aid Services and speak to a Financial Aid Services Counselor for additional questions regarding a student's overall financial aid package. A student athlete must be enrolled full time (12.0 quarter hours or more each term) to receive an athletic scholarship. A student athlete enrolled for less than 12.0 quarter hours in a term will become ineligible for all AIB scholarships for that term. This stipulation reflects the Less Than Full-time Enrollment Policy established by Financial Aid Services.

CHEERLEADING SCHOLARSHIP (Associate & Bachelor)

This \$500 maximum annual scholarship is available for full-time students participating in the AIB Cheerleading Program. The scholarship is distributed over the winter, spring, and summer terms. Students may receive this scholarship in addition to one of the aforementioned merit scholarships/grants. Participants are required to complete the financial aid process each year. The Cheerleading Scholarship is for tuition only and is awarded in conjunction with any federal and state assistance. The scholarship is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.0 for the scholarship to continue. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the scholarship for the duration of the student's time in college.

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS 2012-2013

DOLLARS FOR SCHOLARS (Associate Only)

Up to \$300 for one term

AIB is a matching partner in the Dollars for Scholars high school scholarship program. The College will award a one-time match of up to \$300 for any Dollars for Scholars Scholarship. Students may receive this grant in addition to one of the aforementioned merit scholarships/grants.

TUITION EXCHANGE PROGRAM (Associate & Bachelor)

Up to \$4,600 tuition per term

Up to \$1,050 campus housing per term

AIB College of Business is a member of the Tuition Exchange Program. Hundreds of private colleges throughout the US belong to this program. Students with a parent employed by a private college may be eligible for the Tuition Exchange Benefit Program which includes a full tuition scholarship and housing benefit. Participants are required to complete the financial aid application process in a timely manner. The Tuition Exchange benefit is for tuition and housing only and is awarded in conjunction with all federal, state, and AIB institutional grant assistance. The benefit is renewable upon maintaining proper social standing as well as a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA that will be reviewed at the end of each term. If the required GPA is not attained, the student will be allowed a one term grace period. The cumulative GPA at the end of the grace period must be at or above 2.0 for the scholarship to continue. The student will remain in the grace period until their cumulative GPA is at or above 2.0. If the required cumulative GPA is not attained after the grace period, the student will lose eligibility for the benefit until the required GPA is again met. It is the responsibility of the student to notify Financial Aid Services if eligibility is regained.
