

Assessment of the effectiveness of the school's drug and alcohol abuse prevention program  
The following are some examples of some of the strategies AIB has implemented that have a positive influence on the campus culture regarding alcohol and drug abuse:

- Launched Campus Care Team
- Prohibit alcohol promotions and advertising on campus
- Keep recreational facilities open longer
- Prohibit alcohol promotions and advertising on campus and in campus publications
- Provide a wide range of alcohol-free social and recreational activities
- Discipline repeat offenders and those who engage in unacceptable behavior associated with substance abuse
- Notify parents when students receive engage in violations of alcohol or other drug policies or laws
- Implement a fining system for repeat alcohol violations

The Campus Care Team was officially established in January, 2009. The primary purpose of the Campus Care Team is to identify students of concern, be pro-active, intervene, and provide needed assistance to help the student. Referred students meet with the Director of Student Counseling. Students are required to sign an "Authorization for Release of Information" form at the AIB Counseling office and the community resource provider, which allows communication of the students' assessment results, treatment recommendations (if needed), and student progress and program completion records. We have found students receiving the necessary treatment have been successful.

**Any changes in the school's drug and alcohol abuse prevention program, as needed**

- Parental Notification – parents with students under the age of 21 are notified if the student is found in violation of any AIB alcohol or controlled substance policies. Added Fall 2008.
- Previously, if a student reached a third alcohol violation they would be placed on Social Probation automatically. Social probation consisted of students losing any AIB related scholarships. However, some students who were placed on social probation were not receiving scholarships. The College decided a fining system would be a more fair warning to all students. In 2009, a \$150.00 fine was implemented for a third alcohol violation.

**ALCOHOL VIOLATIONS**

2008

- 1<sup>st</sup> offense – written reminder
- 2<sup>nd</sup> offense – written reprimand
- 3<sup>rd</sup> offense – student placed on social probation
- 4<sup>th</sup> offense – suspension from college housing and may also result in suspension from AIB entirely.

2009 – Present

- 1<sup>st</sup> offense – written reminder
- 2<sup>nd</sup> offense – written reprimand
- 3<sup>rd</sup> offense - \$150 fine
- Subsequent violations will result in further disciplinary action, including but not limited to, social probation, dismissal from campus housing, and/or fines up to \$250.00*

- Previously, a student found in violation of a drug violation was asked to leave campus housing immediately. In 2009, a decision to allow students to remain in campus housing if they follow a strict set of guidelines, including seeking out a counselor.

**DRUG VIOLATION**

2008

1. Student placed on social probation

2. Student immediately suspended from campus housing
3. Parents may be notified of action taken.
4. Student referred to the Director of Student Counseling
5. Student required to seek professional counseling (this includes an outpatient assessment and follow-through treatment, if recommended)

2009 – Present

- Reported Alcohol violations decreased by 10% from 2008-2009
- In the spring of 2008, the College became a Tobacco-Free Campus. The policy is in compliance with the Iowa Smokefree Air Act. AIB has chosen to extend its policy beyond the provisions of the law to include the use of all tobacco products.
